... on board such Ship, Schoon or Boats or the full value thereof
in money whereof one third to her Majesty for the support of the Government
of this province the other two thirds to them that will be for the same
to be recovered in any Court of Record in this province by action of Debt Bill
Plaint or Information without any protection or wager of Law to be
allowed.

And be it further enacted by the Authority aforesaid that
any Master and Commander of any Ship or other Vessel as aforesaid
shall take any such Tobacco on board his Ship or Vessel before he shall
publish such Note as aforesaid he shall forfeit for every such Negligence
the Sum of twenty Shillings to the use aforesaid to be recovered as aforesaid.

* And be it further enacted by the Authority aforesaid that
every Master & Commander of Ship or Vessel as aforesaid shall send
any Ship or other Craft to another County to take Tobacco to be put
on board his Ship or Vessel or freight shall send by the Shipper or Master
of such Ship or other Craft a Certificate under the hand of the Clerk of that
County where such Note of Freight was published as aforesaid Certifying the rate of
his Freight and publication thereof as aforesaid under the penalty of
forfeiting forty Shillings to the use aforesaid to be recovered as aforesaid
And the Collectors and Naval Officers shall at the Charge of the County where
such Collectors and Naval Officers shall inhabit procure Copies of this Law for
each Copy whereof the said County Clerk shall have ten pounds of Tobacco
and no more and give the same in their Office or Offices on or before the tenth
day of December next ensuing under the penalty of forty Shillings to be
paid for each neglect forfeit and paid to the use aforesaid to be recovered as
aforesaid.
