


and a reasonable time of payment which is the birthday of October
yearly until which time to continue the whole Assembly sitting
for that occasion only would be very chargeable and burdensome
to the whole province in general for the provision whereof.

Be it enacted by His Excellent most excellent
Majesty by and with the Advice and Consent of Her Majesty's Governor
Council and Assembly of this province and the authority of the same
that Colonel Thomas Smith a Delegate for Kent County M^r Samuel Young
M^r Joseph Hill and Major Charles Sprenckley for Amherst County
together with Colonel John Hammond of Her Majesty's Honorable
Council or the Major part of them shall be and appear at the Council
Commence some time as to them shall seem convenient between the
second day and last day of October Instant then and there to lay and assist
what further Charges may accrue which to them shall justly appear
to be due from the publick not exceeding the sum of fifty thousand pounds
of Tobacco and one hundred pounds in money more than what is already
raised and likewise to apponion order and pay out of the publick
Treasury of this province so much money as shall appear by the
Journal of Accounts of the last and this present Session of Assembly
to be due together with what the said Committee shall further allow ac-
cording to the Limitation and Intent of this Act to the several persons to
whom the same shall be due according to former usage for paying the
publick Charge and a fair Journal of all their proceedings to be delivered
to the Clerk of the Assembly for satisfaction of all persons there with
concerned.
