# An Act ascertaining the Expences of the Coun- -cillors Delegates of Assembly and Comissioners of the pro- -vincial and County Courts of this province

*The purposes of this Act  
are provided for by  
the Act made in 1716  
which is now  
obsolete*

For the ascertaining limiting and allowing unto the Govern-  
-and respective Councillors Deputies and Delegates that serve or shall  
-serve in the general Assemblies of this province and of the severall and  
-respective Comissioners of the provincial and County Courts of this province  
Such sum and sums of Tobacco as is hereby thought necessary and  
-sufficient for their defraying their Charges in attending such Assemblies &  
-Courts Be it enacted by the Queens most Excellent Majesty by and  
-with the Advice and Consent of her Ma<sup>ty</sup> her Council and Assembly of this  
-province and the Authority of the same that all such Councillors be allowed the  
-sume of one hundred and fifty pounds of Tobacco per day and the Delegates  
-of the Assembly shall be allowed the sume of one hundred and  
-fifty pounds of Tobacco per day during the time they shall attend such
