

An Act confirming purchases made by the  
Commissioners of his respective Counties by virtue of a former Act  
of Assembly Intituled an Act empowering the Commissioners of  
each respective County to purchase Lands for use of their  
respective Courts &c

Whereas at a General Assembly hold at the port of Annapolis  
the twenty<sup>fourth</sup> day of May One thousand Six hundred Ninety seven  
a certain Act of Assembly was made Intituled An Act empowering  
the Commissioners of each respective County to purchase Lands for the  
use of their respective Courts which is now executed.

Be it Enacted by the Queens most excellent Majesty  
by and with the Advice and Consent of her Majestys Governour  
Councill and Assembly of this Province and the Authority of the  
Same, that what purchases of Lands the Commissioners had made ac-  
cording to the said Act for the use of the respective Counties and recorded  
within the severall and respective County Courts wherunto they  
properly belong shall be a perpetual Bar against him or them  
from whom the Land was purchased and against all persons claiming  
by from or under him her him or any of them for ever.

And be it further enacted that the Lot whereon  
the Court House of Douletts new Stand and the Towns House  
remain to the use of the County for ever as by the last paragraph  
of the said Act is more at large expressed.
