

2. 1. 1. *Continued* to the Governour of this Province
the duty of three pence per Ton upon the Tonnage of Ships &
Voyages.

Whereas the Governours of this Province have heretofore had and
enjoyed a duty of three pence per Ton of the Tonnage of all Ships and Voyages
trading into this Province.

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen most
excellent Majesty by and with the Advice and Consent of her
Majestys Governour Council and Assembly of this Province and the
Authority of the same that the several and respected Masters of
all Ships of Voyages trading and coming into this Province of what
Condition soever shall at the time of entering such Ships and Voyages
as aforesaid pay unto the Governour of this Province for the time being
three pence per Ton for every Ton of Tonnage the said Ship or
Voyage shall be of or give good Caution to the Navall Officer with whom
the or they shall enter for payment thereof ^{such} All Ships or Voyages as are
bona fide built in or belonging to the people of this Province excepted.
