 gained cease and determine and that the said fifty Acres of Land with
 all the Tenements Hereditaments and appurtenances thereto belonging
 or in any wise appertaining be settled and vested in the said Susanna
 Potanoy her Heirs and Assigns for ever any Claims of the said Benjamin
 Blackbeach his Heirs or Assigns or any Law Statute usage or Custom to
 the contrary in any wise notwithstanding.
