 of the late of Saint Marys County deceased being in favour of his
 And the last Will and Testament of Doim Whimfelle late of Talbot County
 deceased being in favour of his son Jonas Whimfelle and each and either of the
 last Wills and Testaments be good and effectual in Law to all Intents Constructions
 and purposes whatsoever to pass the said Lands therein mentioend and to pass Vest
 and settle the severall Estates of Inheritance therein expressed to be devised to
 the severall persons and their Heirs therein mentioend according to the Intent
 of the Testators notwithstanding that the said Wills were only published and declared
 in the presence of two Witnesses whereas more by Law was required than by any Law
 Statute or Usage to the contrary in any wise notwithstanding.

And be it further Enacted by the Authority Advice and Consent
 aforesaid that the last Will and Testament of Doim Durnam late of Talbot County
 deceased shall be good and effectual in the Law to all Intents purposes and Con-
 structions whatsoever and shall be sufficient to pass the Lands therein mentioend
 and to Vest and settle the same therein mentioend in and amongst Doim his Heirs and
 assigns forever according to the Intention of the said testator. ~~Notably~~ by
 Honage in the Testator notwithstanding.

And that the Will of the said Doim Whimfelle having not yet
 entred upon Record in the County of ^{Office} Talbot be now received and recorded in the
 County Office and accepted and taken as all times as the will of the said
 Whimfelle.
