province into some Island in the West Indies and be there to serve seven years
and the money arising from the Sale shall be applied toward the Defraying the
or Sentence of Death and given against the said Benjamin Cole in any case
standing.

AND Be it enacted by the Authority aforesaid by and with the advice
and consent of that it shall be felony without any benefit of clergy for the
the said Benjamin Cole to return into this province within the term of seven
years after he commences from the time of his deportation.

WHEREAS it appears to this general Assembly upon oath
that there has been a very wicked and treasonable conspiracy be-
gun and carried on by Richard Cark of Annarundell County and
his accomplices to seize upon the Magazine and upon the
Army the Governor and overturn her Majesty's Government and to
bring the Native Indians together with the said conspirators to
offend and separate the Inhabitants of this province and as much
as the said Cark flies from Justice and does not venture himself upon
a fair trial
