An Act Explaining some Doubtfull
Expressions in the act for Limitation of
Officers Fees &c

Whereas in the said act for Limitation of Officers
Fees it is expressed the Secretary shall have for every
Execution and Return ~~and~~ And a blank left
for the sume when it ought to have been expressed
Twenty eight pounds of Tobacco.

Be it Enacted by the Queens most Excellent
Majty by and with the advice and Consent of her Majes-
tys Governour Councell and assembly of this province and
the authority of the same that he shall have for an Execu-
tion and returne Twenty eight pounds of Tobacco and for
any matter Entered upon Record not Exceeding half a
side Eight pounds of Tobacco and for every Continuance
in Chancery Sixteen pounds of Tobacco.

And be it Enacted, That such fees in the severall
Cases aforesaid as were appointed by his Excellency the Gover-
nour in Councell to be paid to the Secretary untill this
present session of Assembly shall be satisfied and paid to
the Secretary by the Persons from whome the same are due
and on nonpayment thereof it shall be Lawfull to Levy the
same by way of Execution.

This act to endure so Long as the said act for Limitation
of Officers fees shall be in force and no longer.
