Honourable the Lord Proprietary of the Province  
of the said George and by Judgment of the Assembly of the  
Province upon Inquisition so adjudged the Twenty second day of  
one thousand five hundred Eighty three & afterwards by an  
Act of February one thousand five hundred Eighty four granted  
the present Lord Baltimore unto the said Richard Bourchier  
Tunc in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and five.  
Psd John Gandy being Certified that the said George Read had an  
estate at Law in that part of Great Britain before called Peck's  
being desirous to make himself a Tenant to the said Land  
employed an agent to purchase for him the Right of the said George  
Read not only to the aforesaid Tract of Land called Headbourne  
Likewise two or three smaller Tracts of Land lying near the River of  
Dulverton & principally to all the Lands and Tenements whatsoever  
which the said George Read had any right to hold in this province  
for a valuable Consideration by the said John Gandy paid to the said George  
Read his Rent Law was settled and some Deeds of Lease and Release duly executed  
by the said Estate at Law to the said John Gandy of the said Lands with power  
of attorney by him directed to W<sup>m</sup> Dent Gentleman deceased and Charles Garret  
to acknowledge the said Deeds according to the Law of this province  
In such Cases to run the said John Gandy & his Heires which was accordingly  
done by the said William Dent & Charles Garret at the Provincial Court  
In this province next before that in which the said Power was given That  
it happened that the said Deeds of Lease & Release with due Authentication  
probates thereof as also the authentic probates of the parties  
who Executed the same being the seal and Rightfull Seal of the  
of the said George Read were burnt in the State house or Court  
after the Clerk had made some progress in Recording the same  
whereby the said John H. Dye's Title who purchased for the  
Consideration of five hundred pounds Sterling from the said  
John Gandy the said Tract of Land called Headbourne as by  
Authentic Deeds bearing date the sixteenth Day of January  
one thousand seven hundred and four may appear of the said  
Gandy's Title like other Lands not sold to him by the  
are defective & not valid by the Law of Assembly.
