Salary of the Knights of the Shire. Be it therefore  
Enacted that the Citizenes respecting the City of Aniopolis shall only  
be allowed halfe the wages to the Delegates and Representatives as was an  
shall be allowed to the Delegates of the severall Countys of this  
Province and no more. And whereas Wm. Hunt Esq; the present  
Recorder of the said City is not yett qualified for that Trust by reason his  
Residence nott been resident in this Province during the former of three  
years. Nevertheless the said Wm. Hunt by vertue of this act shall be  
deemed and thereby qualified and enabled to hold and execute the  
said office of Recorder of the City aforesaid any Law Statute Usage  
or Custom to the contrary in any wise notwithstanding —

And be it Enacted by the advice and Consent aforesaid —  
that the Land called the Town Common be reserved & remains to the  
use of the proper owner or owners unless the Citizenes can make appear  
they have made satisfaction for the same before the Session of Assembly  
by the Rowne of Delegates the 15<sup>th</sup> December 1708.
