

no Voyage protection or wages of Law to be allowed —
And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid —
Consent aforesaid that from & after the end of this present
Session of Assembly no attorney or other person whatsoever —
Shall practise the Law in any of the Courts of this province —
without being admitted thereto by the Justices of the several
Courts who are hereby empowered to admit and suspend them
/ Salvajne Grounds / until it her maj. ty's pleasure shall be known
therein nor shall any attorney or other person practising the
Law in this province be obliged to pay unto any Clerk of any
County Court any fee or fees due to them from any person or
persons whatsoever Plaintiffs or Defendants living or residing
within this province but such Clerks shall or may take the
same of such Plaintiffs or Defendants in the Counties where
they live any Law Statute Usage Custom rule of Court or
order from any persons to the contrary notwithstanding —

Provided always that nothing in this act shall extend
or be construed to extend to give right to any Courts of this
province to admit any attorney or other person practising
the Law to practise in any Court that has been already refused
so to do by his Excellency and her maj. ty's hon^{ble} Council
nor to any person that shall not qualify himself by taking
the oaths appointed to be taken by Acts of Parliament for
securing the Succession & Limitation of the Crown & better
securing the Rights & Liberties of the Subject This act to continue
for three years and from thence to the end of the next Session
of Assembly after the said three years —
