An Act for appointing Court

Days in each Respective County within this province  
To the Intent that Court days may be ascertained and that the  
Commissioners within their Respective County may know when to attend  
But Enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty by and  
with the advice and Consent of her maj<sup>ty</sup> Governour Council &  
Assembly of this Province and the authority of the same that for  
the future there shall be held but four County Courts in one year  
(Viz<sup>t</sup>) Somersett Kent Baltimore and St<sup>ts</sup> Maries County the  
first Tuesday in March June August and November Dorchester  
Cecele Ann Arundell and Charles County the second Tuesday in  
June August and November in Talbot and Calvert County the  
third Tuesday in March June August and November Queen  
and Prince Georges County the fourth Tuesday in March  
August and November -
