An Act for relief of Tobias Pollard and John Pollard of Dorchester County Gentlemen

Whereas Tobias Pollard Second Son of John Pollard late of Dorchester County deceased and John Pollard Grandson and heir at Law to the said John Pollard Esquire have petitioned this General Assembly that the aforesaid John Pollard Esquire his last will and Testament had devised to a certain Wm. Pollard deceased father of the petitioner John Pollard several Tracts of Land (Viz) Winfield's point Tobias Lett the Spear Grass Needer Hamersmith Patrick's Wells, and Williams Goodwill, and to the said Tobias Pollard Divers other Tracts of Land (Viz) Marsh Land Sharpout Lett. Sharp's desire Blood point John's desire the Raw, Island in the Marsh Woolf Trapp Ridge, Goatton an good Luck point, And the heirs Males of their Bodies Lawfully begotten, all which said Tracts of Lands lying and being in Dorchester County aforesaid, the Children of the said Tobias Pollard being daughters, are not capable of Inheriting Reason of the Special Tayle aforesaid, and the said John Pollard being deceased and not likely of ever having any heirs, the said Tobias and John Pollard therefore humbly prayed this General Assembly would give Leave to bring in a bill for their Relief by enlarging their Estates into a Tayle General

Be it therefore Enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and Consent of her Majesty's Council and Assembly of this province and the authority of the same that the said John Pollard the Grandson and Tobias Pollard the Younger Son of the said John Pollard Esquire deceased each and either of them shall the authority of this General Assembly and by virtue of this act severally have hold and enjoy and to all Intents and purposes whatsoever be deemed and adjudged to hold enjoy and be severally possess of the several Tracts of Land and Tenements as by the said will devised and have Estate therein in Tayle General any Law Statute Usage Custom or any Article or Clause in the said will to the contrary notwithstanding
