 the City of Annapolis the Twenty Eight day of November one thousand Seven hundred
 Eight entitled an act for the relief of poor debtors and languishing prisoners nor
 any Law thereof shall be put in Execution by any person or persons whatsoever
 upon or under any Colour or pretence whatsoever untill the end of the next Sessions
 of Assembly any thing in the said act or any other act to the contrary (excepted notwith-
 standing) PROVIDED allways that nothing in this act shall extend or be construed
 to extend to debar or hinder the Justice of the severall County Courts to allow the
 benefit of the said act to any person or persons that shall be actually in prison or
 Custody of any Sheriff or Gaoler upon any arrest or Execution at or upon the Eight
 day of November one thousand Seven hundred and nine or that have already claimed
 the benefit thereof any thing in this act to the contrary notwithstanding

An Act for the Naturalization of Dan^l Pacquet of Annarundell County
 Labourer

It is Enacted by the Queens most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice
 and Consent of her Majesty's Council and Assembly of this province and the authority
 of the same that Dan^l Pacquet of Annarundell County Labourer having taken
 the severall Oaths appointed to be taken by act of Parliament shall be from henceforth
 adjudged, reputed and taken as a naturall borne Subject of this province, and that
 he by the authority aforesaid be enabled and adjudged to all Intents and purposes
 to demand Challenge, Assize, Writ, and enjoy any Lands Tenements Rents
 and hereditaments to which he might in any wise be entitled as if he was
 a Naturall borne Subject, and also that he shall and may be enabled to
 speake, maintaine, avow Justifie and defend all manner of Actions Sutes,
 Pleas, plaints, and other demands whatsoever, as liberally frankly freely
 Lawfully and Securly, as if he was a naturall borne Subject within this
 province any Law Statute Usage or Custome to the contrary in anywise
 Notwithstanding
