

Major Council and assembly of this province and the authority of the same that on the 5th day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred four did enact prohibiting the Importation of Bread, Beer, Flower, Malt, Wheat, or other English or Indian Grain or Meal, Horses, Mares, Colts, or fillies, from Pennsylvania, and the several Colonies thereto belonging, and Revised at a General Assembly held at the Port of Annapolis the twenty fifth Day of March the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred seven and is hereby Revised and Continued in full force and strength from and after the End of this present Session of Assembly, and during the Space of three years, and to the End of the next Session of Assembly, which shall happen after the End of the said three years, Provided that the said Act or anything therein contained shall not take or be construed to extend to any Horses or Horses brought into this province by Travellers for their own use only and not intended for Sale nor to any person or persons that shall remove themselves or into this province in their families in order to settle themselves.

An Act for Confirmation of the Last will and Testament of William Dixon late of Talbot County Governor deceased

Whereas William Dixon of Talbot County Governor deceased did by his last will and Testament in writing bearing date the sixteenth day of the third month of May in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eight on laying a Relation all disposition of his Estate both Real and personal, as will signed by the proper hand and hand or right hand of the said William Dixon as appears by several probers on the back of the will Registered or Recorded in the Consistory Court of the Bishop of the said Province in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eight, but yet the said will is not evidenced by the Testimonies of Witnesses, but generally by all persons that know the Character or handwriting believed to be the true and deep of the said testator and that for want of such Testimonies of Witnesses generally it may be Doubtfull whether or the said will be good and whether the said devise shall be a good and certain Inheritance in the said devised or the said devisee's right to claim and demand their Legacy and that no person or persons should object against the said will. Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of her Majesty's Council and assembly of this province and the authority of the same that the said will be Recorded or Registered as aforesaid at all times and in all Courts of this province admitted, Doubted and taken for the true and last will and Testament of the said William Dixon and that the Devisees and Legatees in the said will mentioned have and enjoy their several Devisees and Legacyes as fully to all intents and purposes as if the said will had been subscribed and proved by three Witnesses as in and by the said will more fully appears and no withstanding.
