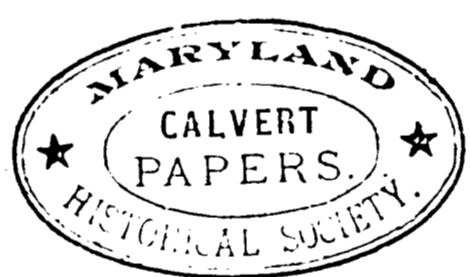


An Act for the Repeal of the Act for Customs

This Assembly considering the ~~clashing~~ Between the Laws made at the Assembly held the second day of January 1626 at ~~St James~~ Jamestowne ~~Fort~~ wherein in consideration of the Custom in that Act granted to his Lordship the right Honourable the Lord Proprietary to doth undertake the whole charge of the Government both in warre and in peace and that other Act Confirmed by his Lordships Declaration bearing date the sixth day of August 1650 Entitled an Act concerning Seaweing of wares within this province in the last Clause of which Act the whole charge of any wares coming within this province is to be leaved upon the province by an equal Assesment upon the persons and Estates of the Inhabitants thereof any thing in that Act or any other Act to the contrary thereof notwithstanding and further taking into serious Consideration the burthen of that Act and the vast charge that has been drawn upon the province by the late buccanners Revolt of Jonas Kendall and his Impires and the great expence they must be at to Defend the province against the incursions of the Spaniards Indians that of late have murdered some of the Inhabitants thereof the which charge by Act of this present Assembly they have undertaken so pray that the Authority of the Lord Proprietary with the consent of the upper and lower House of the General Assembly the said Act made at an Assembly held the second day of January 1626 at Jamestowne Fort and Entitled an Act for Customs may be repealed And Be it Enacted by the Authority and consent aforesaid that the said Act for Customs is hereby utterly repealed forever -
