

Coroner in every County Be it therefore enacted  
By the King's highness, the Lord Prop. of this Province  
with the assent of the Superior & lower house of their  
General Assembly that the King, the Lords, Gent,  
for the better being do constitute & appoint  
from or from from time to time to be Coroner  
and he shall judge most able & best qualified  
for that office in every respective County in this  
Province And be it further enacted that the  
Lieutenant Generall give out Letters to such  
persons to the intent & purpose aforesaid And  
that the same as well as may, be made  
with the laws & Constitution of England And  
that an Oath be administered to every such Coroner  
by appointment of the Lieutenant Generall at his  
entering into the Office according to the  
forms of the oath of a Coroner in England.

6) Whereas by articles of Peace drawn and  
concluded on by the Grand Council of both  
of this present General Assembly and the  
20<sup>th</sup> day of April 1666 signed by the  
hon<sup>ble</sup> Govern<sup>r</sup> and as many of the great  
men of Sagadahaw, Anasquan, Doag,  
Kibiwoman, Manasquan, Mattawoman,  
Chingwanatow, Mangomaid, Portobart,  
Sarago, Langayo, and Shaptin, as were  
present
