

An Act for Building a Prison at
St Mary's

Forasmuch as it doth not please the Government, to
not give out for want of prisons to confine and keep
felons & persons incorrigible laborers for discharge
thereof & for the safety of the King & Queen, & the
King's Subjects, for the same Prison to be built
there be found areas of land made off a 88 the spring
on y^e East side of St Mary's Land to be allotted to be
a prison upon what there be London thousand pounds
of labour rayled out of y^e probate this next day
beginning frome to be laid out upon building a prison
upon y^e aforesaid found areas of land and in regard Ray-
mond Applefort hath wherein taken to build y^e said Prison
upon condition he may be keeper of y^e said Prison
during life, & so it further enacted that the said Raymon-
d Applefort have thousand pounds of labour paid
unto him beginning sufficient security that the said Prison
shall be well & sufficiently built at St Mary's foundry
before y^e 23rd April 1667 & that he provide, have
call other workmen for y^e restraining & keeping
offenders, that then he have a patent made by y^e queene
Seal of this province to be keeper of y^e said Prison
for doing of terms of his naturall life.

And for y^e further Encouragement of having y^e said Prison
to build the same before said time necessary for y^e
Administration of Justice with further enacted that
all criminals attested of any offence which doth in
any part of this Province the punishment of which can
any way touch the person attested in his life or limb
or not capable by y^e law of England shall be by
fushe or otherwise executed or punisched before whom he is
attested immediately sent by mittimus to y^e Prison at St
Mary's there to be kept in safe custody till his trial
be determined by due and lawful course, And for the better
