An Act concerning Ordinary Keepers

Forasmuch as it is found by Experience That noe certaine rate can  
be sett upon liquors sold by Ordinary Keepers by Retaille, because no  
rate certaine can be sett upon the English goods from whom the  
Ordinary Keepers must purchase their liquor. Be it Enacted by  
the Right Honble the Lord Proprietary with the advice & consent of  
the Upper & Lower houses of this present Genl Assembly & the Authority  
of the same, that from henceforth every person be left to agree with  
the Ordinary Keepers for any liquor or other Accommodation Except  
Beer dyett Lodging & horse meat shal be it further Enacted by the  
Authority aforesaid, that from henceforward noe Ordinary Keeper  
shall demand above thirteen pounds of tobacco & meal for dyett, for  
small beer seven pds of tobacco & face for strong beer Twenty pounds  
of tobacco & face, for nights Lodging in bed with sheets four pounds  
of tobacco, for a Peck of Indian Sheld Corn or Oates for a horse hodw  
pounds of tobacco, for pasture for a horse six pounds of tobacco off  
night, for hay or straw for a house seven pounds of tobacco off night  
and to the end that the good people of this Province (attending  
publick Sessions of Genl Assembly as also Provinciall Courts and  
the severall respective County Courts within this Province being  
hereunto lawfully called & summoned) may be certaine of their  
deacones sufficient for their horses as well as for themselves &c  
Enacted by the Authority advice & consent aforesaid That every  
Ordinary Keeper within this Province shall from easter the first  
day of October next after publication hereof be obliged to provide  
maintaine Accommodation of Oats hay straw for litter & Indian  
Corn together with stable roome convenient & sufficient for twelve  
horses at the least under penality of forfetting & paying the summe of  
ten Thousand pounds of tobacco One scatell of the Lord Proprietary  
the other halfe to the Informer or to him or them that shall sue for  
the same to be recovered in any Court of Record within this Province  
wherein noe Escomme loager or protection in Law to be allowed  
and be it further Enacted by the Authority advice & consent aforesaid  
That from & after publication hereof noe Ordinary Keeper shall  
credite any Freeman in this Province (not being a freeholder &  
depending upon his labour for the paym: of his deute) for any  
summe of tobacco exceeding the summe of one hundred pounds in  
any one year upon paine of loss of his whole debt whiche doth  
Bill Boild or Acceppt and forasmuch as some strangers trade  
this Province who have noe Tobacco in this Province, & others  
that are Inhabitants in this Province may spend small summes  
amounting to a hhd of tobacco Be it also Enacted by the Authority
