to remove a cause from an Inferiour Court to a Superior Be-
it Enacted by the authority aforesaid That any person p^r or
Defend^t may Appeals from the Judgem^t of the County Court to
the Provinciaell Court giving security as aforesaid And the said
Appeals shall be admitted by the Justices of the Provinciaell
Court as in the nature of an *habeas Corpus* to remove the cause
as aforesaid And the party Appellant shall procure a copy
of the proceedings of the said County Court where such Appeals
was made to be transmitted to the Provinciaell Court & prosecute
his Appeals there the then next Provinciaell Court at his perill
This Act to endure for three yeares or to the end of the next
Sessions of Gen^l Assembly which shall first happen

An Act for punishm^t of certain abuses committed
by Henry Ward of Cecil County Gent^l against the
Right Hon^{ble} the Lord Propy & the publick

Whereas Complaint hath been made to the Burgesses and
Delegates of the lower house of Assembly & there sufficiently
proved that the said Henry Ward being Elected a member to
serve in the lower house of the late Assembly, & being there
sitting did Informe the said lower house that he had a very
good horse lost in the Country service in the Expedition to the
Whorekills, & that the lower house giving Credit to such
Informacon did thinke fitt to allow him out of the publick Treasury
Eighteen hundred pounds of Tobacco to which his Lordpp^t the
Cap^t Gen^l & upper house did assent unto, And it being now made
evidently appear to this house that the said Ward lost noe such
horse in the publick service, & that the said Allegation was most
agregiously false, & that thereby he had exceedingly abused the
Lordpp^t & both houses of Assembly & the whole Country, They
