An Additionall Act to the Act for Encouragement
of Tillage and raising Provisions for Advancement of
Trade within this Province.

Be it Enacted by the Right Hon^{ble} the Lord Proprietary by and with the
advice and Consent of the Upper and Lower houses of this present Generall
Assembly and the Authority of the same that all and every person and
persons whatsoever that shall solely and wholly employ his time or any
number of his servants or others belonging to his family in the tilling
ordering and dressing his land or any part thereof in order for the
Propagating of all or any sort of English grains and Indian Corns and
shall not at any time putt or employ any of the persons aforesaid in
planting tending or making Tobacco but shall wholly intirely and constantly
follow husbandry. Such person or persons shall have and receive the
overall benefitts and allowances hereafter mentioned, that is to say.
that every such person or persons so wholly employed as aforesaid
shall be exempt and free from all Publick and County Levys and
shall also be allowed out of the County Levy wherin the said grain
shall be so made the sum of six pounds of Tobacco or Bushell for all
or any sort of English grains, The Quantity being made appear by two
sufficient witnesses before the Justices of each County Court according to
law, and likewise if any person well skilled in the making of Malt
shall of the usuall grains of wheate or Barly of the Production of
