

and or by Law ought to be any other Law or usage to the contrary notwithstanding, And whereas the Inhabitants of Langford Bay Hundred in the County of Kent have humbly prayed that they may have a Town upon a certain point in the said Bay called Cackaway Point they having no Town port or place of Trade whereto they can carry their goods and Merchandizes but with great difficulty and change of winds and danger of (damaging) their said goods and Merchandizes in loading and unloading at the adjacent Towns by means of great Shoals. Bee it therefore enacted by the Authority aforesaid that One hundred Acres of land on the said Cackaway point being formerly the land of Toby Wolls for the use and benefit of the Inhabitants of the said Bay be surveyed and laid out for a Town port and place of Trade and to be called by the name of Gloucester Town under such Limitations and with the benefit of such Privileges as to other Towns nominated and appointed by the Act for Advancement of Trade and Supplementary Acts to the same are allowed, And whereas also it is found absolutely necessary for the Convenience of the Inhabitants of the several Hundreds in the several Counties hereafter named that Towns ports and places of Trade be erected in such places of the said Counties as is hereafter nominated and appointed Bee it also enacted by the Authority aforesaid that for the benefit of the Inhabitants of St. Michaels Hundred in St. Marys County one Town port or place of Trade be surveyed and laid out at the head of St. Jeroms Creek upon the land of M. William Guythor to be called by the name of St. Jeroms Town, and for the ease and benefit of the Inhabitants in and about St. Marys that one Town port and place of Trade be surveyed and laid out on the South side of Bottrant River in Calvert County between Abbingtons Creek and Josephs Blod in such convenient place as the Commissioners appointed for Towns in the said County shall think fit to be called by the name of St. Josephs Town also one other Town port or place of Trade to be surveyed and laid out at Bowling Point in the mouth of Bottrant River to be called by the name of

Bowlington
