

Justice of Peace or to ye Comander in Chief of ye Militia in any County within this Province of any Difference they shall know or hear of betwixt the sayd Negro Subjects and ye Indians or amongst ye Indians themselves or of any Cause of Suspicion of such Difference whether Signified by Words or Actions

And for it further Quoted by ye Authority Advice & Consent aforesaid that it shall not be lawfull for any of the sayd Subjects to buy or purchase from any Indian or Indians whatsoever any Gunne or Matchlock for Liquor upon pain of returning to ye Indian or Indians such Gunne or Matchlock by them purchased and also of losing ye price or value of ye Liquor sold them for such Gunne and Matchlock nor shall any of the sayd Subjects whatsoever Trust any Indian or Indians for Liquor or take any pawn or pawns from them on any pretence whatsoever on pain of losing their Debt for such Liquor so Credited to ye Indians as aforesaid and being Obliged to restore ye Indians pawn as aforesaid without any Reward or Satisfaction therefore Any Law Statute Usage or Customs to ye Contrary notwithstanding

All that to redress ye great Evill Arising to this Province by ye multiplicity of uselesse Worses Inured and Colts that run in the Woods

That the sayd Extravagant multitude of uselesse Worses Inured & Colts that run in ye Woods are found very pernicious and burdnesome to ye Inhabitants of this Province It is thought necessary that some suitable Remedy be provided in that behalfe And therefore

Be it enacted by ye Queens most Excellent Majesty by and with the Advice and Consent of her sayd Councill and Assembly of this Province and ye Authority of ye same that from and after ye last Day of May which shall be in ye Year of our Lord One Thousand seven hundred and thirteon All Stoney Worses shall be kept within good sufficient fences and in case any Stoney Worse or Worses that have been taken or are here fitt for use shall happen to be found
