

45 after the first day of January next, that any Seafaring Man Sailor or Seaman
 (not being an Inhabitant of this Province and generally residing in some
 for any time or times of money above the value of five Shillings in any
 Voyage without Leave or Licence from the Commander of the Ship or
 Vessel to which he belongs upon pain of losing them. And if
 such Virtualler or other person keeping a publick House shall take
 any Bond Bill Note or Bill of Exchange or any other Specialty or
 Obligation for any Debt Contracted by any Sailor or Seaman belonging to any
 Ship or Vessel and, ^{not} being an Inhabitant as aforesaid, such Bond Bill Note
 or Bill of Exchange or other Specialty or Obligation shall be void and of no
 Effect

And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforesaid and Consent as that if
 any Virtualler or keeper of any publick House as aforesaid shall Entertaine
 or harbour any Sailor or Seaman without Licence from the Master or Commander
 of the Ship or Vessel to which he belongs to the delay and hinderance of the
 Business of such Ship or Vessel or the Commander thereof such Virtualler
 or keeper of a publick House or House of Entertainment shall be liable to
 and incur the pain and penalties in the Act of Assembly of this Province
 inflicted on such as Entertaine and deale with Servants, by Law Statute
 Usage or Custome to the contrary notwithstanding

Provided that this Act or any thing therein contained shall not
 extend to the Master or Crew mate of any Ship or Vessel

An Act against Striking sundry sorts of Fish within the
 Limits of this Province

Whereas the frequent striking of fish within the Limits of this
 Province has been Represented to this present Generall Assembly as a
 great Evil to the Inhabitants, in the destruction of their Fishery

Be it therefore Enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty
 by and with the Advice and Consent of her Majors privy Council and Assembly
 of this Province and the Authority of the same that no person here
 whatsover shall hereafter strike or shoot any fish within the Limits
 aforesaid with any Arrow or any other sort of striking Instruments nor
 shall attempt to goe out upon the Water in Canoe or Boat or other Vessels
 Fitt for that purpose in any light time recorded with Lights or other
 Signals for striking upon the penalties hereafter mentioned that is to
 say for every light that any person shall goe out upon the Water in such
