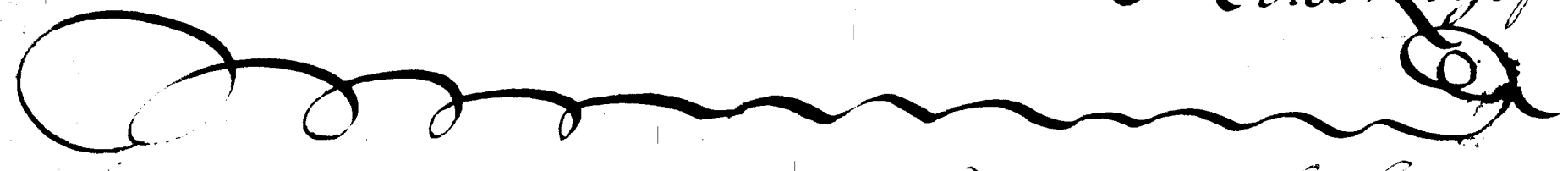

Enacted

An Act reviving a Certain Act of Assembly of this province Entituled an Act ascertaining fees to the Attorneys and practitioners of the Law in the Courts of this province and for levying the same by way of Exaction

Be it Enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty and with the Advice and Consent of her Majesty's most Excellent Council in Assembly of this province and the Authority of the same, That the above mentioned Act ascertaining fees to the Attorneys and practitioners of the Law in the Courts of this province and for levying of the same by way of Exaction made at a Session of Assembly begun and held at the Court of Chancery November the Twenty Ninth Anno Domini One Thousand Seven Hundred Eight and is hereby Revised and continued in full force and strength from and after this next Session of Assembly for three years and to the next Session of Assembly after three years
