worth and Katharine his wife the other of ye late Edward Woolringworth's
survived ye General Assembly last held for this province that
entended it appeared by ye last will and Testament of their father
Edward Woolringworth dated ye twenty fifth day of March anno Domini
thousand seven hundred and ninety two deceased perforce recorded
in ye Conveying General Assembly held before ye death of Edward Woolringworth
hereby (amongst other things therein contained) give and remit
unto his dear and loving wife Katharine Woolringworth ye sum of
thirty five pounds and twenty six pence per annum perforce recorded
in ye Conveying General Assembly held before ye death of Edward
Woolringworth and Katharine aforesaid now ye sole heirs in Estate of
Edward (their mother being dead) they had only in Estate of
Katharine for ye use devised them in trust and although they
