

Such Debtor for so much of the debt and Cost as such goods by such
 appraisment shall amount unto which shall be a sufficient barr ag
 such plaintiff or Creditor and perpetually barr and hinder him from
 taking out any other Execution agt the body goods or Chattels Land or
 Tenements of such Debtor whose goods and Chattels as aforesaid have been
 taken in Execution as of any Law Statute Usage or Custom to the
 contrary notwithstanding. Provided always that nothing in this
 act shall extend or be construed to extend to empower any Sheriff to
 Levy by virtue of any fieri facias for any debt or damage recovered
 against any Speculator or Adm^r any negro or other Slave plate or
 Jewells reserved in favour of Orphans by the act for better admⁿ of
 Justice in probat of wills and granting admⁿ &c. but that the
 Sheriff shall be and are hereby obliged to follow the directions of
 that act touching such negroes and Slave plate and Jewells any
 thing in this act to the contrary notwithstanding

An Act for the relief of Anthony Joy and Anne
 his wife (wherein said Anne is the daughter and Heiress at
 Law to Robert Smith Esq^r late of Queen Anns County deceased
 and the said Anthony one of the Executors of the said Robert Smith
 Testament) in confirming the mortgage of land therein
 mentioned.

Whereas Samuel Wilkes late of Kent County in the
 Province of Maryland Gentleman on or about the third day of
 March Anno Domⁱ 1703 granted himself by his
 Executors & Adm^r to be firmly bound unto Robert Smith of Talbot
 County his heirs Executors adm^r & certain attorney or Attorneys in the
 full and just sum of two hundred thirty two pounds of good and
 lawfull money of England with Condition that if in Case the said
 Samuel Wilkes his heirs Executors and adm^r should deliver unto
 the said Robert Smith his heirs & adm^r certain attorney
 or Attorneys good bills of Exchange payable at London for one
 hundred
