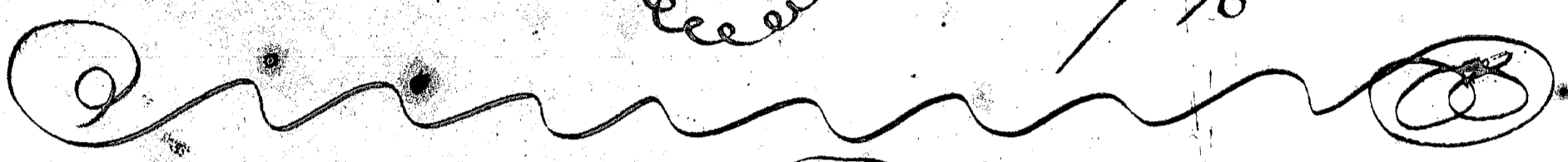

An Act Prohibiting all masters of  
Shipp or Vessels or any other person from Trans-

porting or Convoing away any person or persons out of

this Province without pass

It Enacted by the Kings most Excellent Majesty  
by and with the advice and Consent of his Majestys Governour  
Council and Assembly of this Province and the authority of y<sup>e</sup>  
same that from and after the publication hereof any person  
or persons whatsoever Intending to departe this Province shall first  
give notice of his <sup>their</sup> Intended Departure by setting up his her or  
their Name or names at the Secretaries Office of this Province and  
also at the <sup>Door</sup> of the Court house of the County where such person  
Resides at the time of setting up such Name as at the full Space  
of three months that if in the tynd of no person shall under  
write y<sup>e</sup> said person or persons so setting up his her or their respective  
name or names as afo<sup>r</sup> shall be then Lawfull for the Governour  
keeper of the great seals or Secretary of this Province for the Tynd  
being upon Certificate thereof from the Clerk of the provinciall  
Court and the Clerk of such County where such Name shall be  
sett up as afo<sup>r</sup> to Signe a pass or passes to any such person or persons  
to departe this Province for which the party shall pay to the  
Secretary for signing the same y<sup>e</sup> sume of two shillings and six  
pence, and to the Clerk of the Provinciall County Courts Twelve-pence each.  
And if any Person or Persons upon any sudden or emergent occasion  
are necessitated to departe this Province not having sett up  
his her or their names at the Secretaries Office and County Court  
house as afo<sup>r</sup> then such person or persons giving good and  
Sufficient
