

in any action brought or by the Defendant in his defense against all or any parts of the plaintiffs Claims before such Justice or Justices as are and that no party or parcel thereof is paid other than what Indemnation notice of in the said Oaths shall be received as Evidence to prove the fact in any Court of this Province. Provided that any plaintiff or defendant in any action against whom such oath is given for Evidence shall be at full liberty to traverse such oath by giving Evidence other than himself against it to invalidate the same and the Court or Jury that tries the Cause shall judge by that which appear to them the fullest and fairest Evidence.

An. ACT for Repealing a Clause in
 an act of Assembly Intituled an act for Establishment
 of religious Worshipp in this province &c and also for
 appointing the oaths of Abjuration to be taken in this Province
 JAMES MELVILLE as the pretended Prince of Wales hath soone
 time and doth Continue to Assume to himselfe the Title of King
 of England and the Dominions thereunto belonging by the name
 of James the third therefore for the better Security of his Majesty in
 his just Rights and Sovereignty in and over the Province of
 Maryland and for Extinguishing all hopes of the friends and
 adherents of the said pretended Prince.

Be it Enacted by the Kings most Excellent Majestie
 by and with the advice and Consent of his Highness the
 Governor Council and Assembly of this Province and the Authority
 of the same that from and after the Conclusion of this present
 session of Assembly the oaths of Abjuration shall be administered
 to all persons that already have or shall hereafter be admitted to
 have or enjoy any office or place of trust within this Province
 in such manner and forme as is herein Recited that is to say
 I A B do truly and sincerely Acknowledege for ever to stifie and declare
