

Authority Advice and Consent ^{as} that if the Importer or Importers ^{as} after he hath brought the said Liquors to Botemia Landing ^{as} shall put the said Liquors on board any ^{of} Sell in Chesapeake Bay or any the Rivers Creeks or Harbour thereto belonging before the duty ^{as} shall be paid in ready money ^{as} that then the Importer or Importers shall forfeit the said Liquors or the Value thereof in ready money to the use ^{as} to be recovered ^{as} And be it further Enacted by the Authority ^{as} that when the Importer or Importers aforesaid have made fair Entries ^{as} and paid the duty ^{as} that then the Navall Officer shall give the said Importer ^{as} permit to Carry the Same to any River Creek or Harbour or port or place of this Prince to make Sale of the Same provided allways that if any ^{or persons} shall Import any the Liquors aforesaid from Pennsylvania ^{as} in Sloops or other Vessels by Sea through the Capes of Virginia Chesapeake Bay into this Prince that then such Importer or Importers shall only pay the duty of three pence ^{per} Gallon as otherwise and be it further Enacted by the Authority Advice and Consent ^{as} that the Navall Officer aforesaid for the said duty of Nine pence ^{per} Gallon ^{as} shall account with the publick Treasurer of the Eastern Shoar and the publick Treasurer of the Eastern Shoar shall account to the Generall Assembly of this Prince as is herein after mentioned which said Navall Officer shall make oath before his Excellency the Governour or whom the Governour shall Empower to Administer such Oath that the said Navall Officer shall use his utmost power and Diligence to Cause this act Effectually to be put in Execution and a Cert. of such oath taken shall be Entred upon the Council Book And to Prevent too great a Number of Irish papists being Imported into this Prince Be it further Enacted by the Authority ^{as} by and with the advice and Consent ^{as} that all masters of Ships and Vessels or others Importing Irish Servants into this Prince by land or by water at the time of their Entry shall pay unto the Navall Officer for the Fine being belonging to such port or place where they make their Entry the summe of twenty Shillings sterl ^{per} poll towards the defraying the publick Charge of the ^{and papists} Prince for every Irish Servant so Imported on penalty of five Pounds
