

Discretion of the Justices not Exceeding five hundred pounds for each
 Court they shall serve to be paid out of the severall and respective
 County Levys. And be it further Enacted that it shall
 and may be Lawfull for the Justices of the prov^d Court to allow
 unto every Petit Juror Summoned to serve in the same Court the
 summe of thirty pounds of Tob^o. for every day such Juror shall
 attend in such Service ~~to pay~~ them in the Publick Levy besides the
 summe of one hundred and twenty pounds of Tobacco to be allowed
 Every full Jury that shall pass their Verdict in any Cause to be
 paid by the party for whom such Verdict shall Pass and be allowed
 in the Bill of Cost as usual and that the Clerk of the prov^d Court
 for the time being lay a List of all persons that served as petit
 Jurors in the prov^d Court with an account of the number of days
 they attended and the Countys they were returned for before the
 Committe for Laying and apportioning the Publick Levy yearly
 under the penaltie of six thousand pounds of Tobacco to the King
 his heirs and Successors for support of Government to be recovered
 by Bill plaint or Informations wherein no Esjoyne of Protection
 or wager of Law to be allowed for which he shall be allowed in the
 Publick Levy two hundred pounds of tobacco and no more.

And to Prevent Partiality in Jurors. ~~Be it Enacted~~
 Be it Enacted by the authority Advice and Consent afo^r
 that no Sheriffs shall summons any persons to serve as a petit
 Juror in any Court whatsoever where he hath knowledge such person
 hath any matter of fact depending for tryall ~~or is concerned~~ ⁱⁿ
 at the same Court he is Summoned to serve in and no person having
 such matter of fact ^{depending} for tryall as afo^r shall be admitted ~~as~~
~~as~~ as a qualified Juror between party and party during the
 sitting of such Court that such matter of fact shall be expected to
 be tryed in And be it further Enacted by the authority
 Advice and Consent afo^r that it shall and may be Lawfull for the
 Justices of the prov^d Court to allow unto every person or persons
 shall be legally Summoned to give their evidence in the said Courts
 the summe of forty pounds of tobacco and no more for every day they
 attend at such Court together with their Journeyl Charge as
 usual to be allowed by the Court and paid by the person summoning
 they may and to be Charged in the Bill of Cost in Cases of ~~meum~~
 tum and in all Cases Criminal to be paid according to the
 Directions
