

Consent of his Lordships Governour and the Upper and Lower
 Houses of Assembly and the Authority of the Land that when ever differences
 shall arise between any of the Inhabitants of this province Touching
 the Boundaries of Lands and that if it shall so happen that either of Complainant
 or Defendant shall be related to y^e Major part of the Comps^s appointed in
 any County or have any Estate or Claims of in or unto any Lands Contig-
 uous to the Lands in Dispute It shall and may be Lawfull for the Remainers
 of such Comps^s which are Qualified To nominate appoint and Choose
 one or two good and Lawfull freeholders (as the case shall require) Dwelling
 in the said County who after taking the usuall oaths shall be Legally Qualified
 to act with the remaining Commissioners in all such disputes (and no otherwise
 in ample and Effectuall manners as any Comps^s whatsoever and shall
 Demand and receive the same Rewards for their Trouble - - -

And Whereas the provision in the afd Act For the Comps^s already
 appointed or hereafter to be appointed for Ascertaineing the bounds of
 Land in each county seems to Admitt of a dispute in respect of their Allowances
 of day To prevent which for the future And to Explain such Ambiguous
 Expressions Be it Enacted by the Authority afd By and with the Advice
 and consent afd That Each and Every such Comps^s already appointed or here-
 after to be appointed for Ascertaineing the bounds of Land in Each Respective
 County be allowed the sum of one hundred pounds of Tobacco for Each day they
 already have ~~received~~ or hereafter shall serve as Comps^s and no more -

And forasmuch as by the before recited act no provision is made for Comps^s
 of review Be it therefore Ord^d with the Authority Advice and Consent
 of the said House of Assembly that there be allowed to each Comps^s of Review the sum of
 one hundred pounds of Tobacco for each day he shall serve and attend
 and no more to be paid by such of the said Comps^s as shall be directed
 by the said Act
