

An Act for investing the Right heirs of Edward Day late of Somers-
setts County, with an Estate in fee Simple of Certain Lands in the Said
County

Whereas George Scott of Somerssetts County by his humble
Petition to this Generall Assembly in may last has set forth that one
Edward Day of Somerssetts County a considerable time before his Death
Agreed with a Certain John Huett and Stephen Luffe the att^{ies} in fact of
Thomas Jones and Howells Jones of Monmouthshire in wails for the purchase
of a parcel of Land lying on north Side of Loidecomaco River in Somerssetts
County late Andrew Jones's between Johnsons Creek and Taylors Mill Gutt
Supposed to Containe about Two hundred acres, and Obtained the Said Huetts
and Luffes Bond dated the sixteenth day of July Anno Dom^o Sixteen hundred &
eighty seven in One hundred and Twenty pounds Sterl^o penalty for the due
making over the Said Lands att^{ies} of the Said Thomas and Howells Jones
when thirty pounds of the said purchase money should be paid, that the said
Edward Day was Immediately put into the possession of the Said Land and made
Considerable Improvements thereon and dyed in possession thereof.
That Edward Day in his Lifetime paid the said Thomas and Howells Jones
the Summe of thirty pounds fourteen shill^{ings} and nine pence part of the
said purchase money but dyed Intestate in some time after before
he had got the Land made over, according to the Condition of the bond
of, that the said Edward Day left a sufficient Personall Estate in the
hands of Mary his widow and Administratrix to pay the Residue of
the said purchase money and all his debts of Equal^l or Superior
Nature to the debt due by bond to the Said Jones, And that the said
Mary Administred the Estate of her Deceased husband, but Instead
of paying the said Debt to Jones by bond paid sundry Debts of an
Inferior Nature, and Left the Said bond in she pretended satisfaction
as to the residue, but afterwards got the Said Land made over to her
self on passing her own bond for payment of the ballence, and in about
two years after the death of her husband Day, was Delivered of a male
Child called Abraham Turner, being born out of wedlock to whom the said
Mary has Envojed the Said Land which as in the Said Petition is
alleged, made Equity and Justice is the proper Estate of Inheritance
of Day's Son, and other the Lawfull heirs of the said Edward Day who left
Issue one Son named Isaac and four Daughters, two of the Daughters
dyed Infants, then the Sundry, by which Elizabeth and Ann the two
Daughters Surviving became Coheirs to their Deceased brother, Elizabeth
Married George Scott the petitioner by whom she had the
Children named Day, Scott, and Anne Marye Philip Todd and had three by
