

Entitled Act for Rectifying the ill practices of Attorneys of this province  
 and Ascertaining fees to the Attorney Generall Clerk of Indictment & Barristers &  
 Practitioners of the Law in the Courts of this province & for Settling the true & law-  
 way of Execution the severall Courts have power given them to Admit and  
 suspend such Practitioners Salvo Jure Coronae, and whereas the said Thomas  
 Macnemara and late Suspension from his practice, obtained her late Maj<sup>ty</sup>  
 Order to be restored to it againe, which the said Macnemara has often suggested  
 to be an Exemption of him from the powers Given the severall Courts by this Act  
 whereby the Authority of those Courts is not only become Disobedient in that  
 part but the said Macnemara has seemingly Depended on the said Order as his  
 Justification to treat them in an Indecent manner, when he pleads before them  
 and even to Despise their Authority and affront their Persons which they  
 have been Customed of punishing him for being partly Debauched by the great  
 Interest in England whereon he has frequently abused himself as being far  
 Superior to them, and partly by the threatening Religious & civil Temporal  
 as well as his Method of Practising upon many unthinking people to  
 surprize them into Certificates and Affidavits in his favour, the latter to  
 gaine his Points of those that thwart him, by which he has at length arrived  
 to so Intolerable a Degree of pride and Arrogance that he has even attacked  
 the Governour himself in his Character and Government for Continuing  
 Maurice Birchfield Esq: his Maj<sup>ty</sup> Surveyor Generall against the  
 preferring the said Macnemara to the Collectorship of Dubzenb, as a  
 person of Suspected Character and Principles (the said Macnemara being  
 at his first coming into this province an Irish Papist & since Declared  
 himself to be of the Church of England without any other Motive ever heard  
 of by this Generall Assembly save those of Interest for the sake of his  
 practice, and the having Opportunity thereby of serving a Popish faction on  
 all occasions, as he has frequently done, particularly in <sup>his</sup> appearing in  
 the Defence of some of them when prosecuted in a speciall Court of Oyer  
 and Terminer for Drinking the Pretenders health & Audaciously Cursing  
 his Sacred Majesty King George, and firing the City Guns on the  
 supposed birthday of the Pretender, on which Occasion he so loudly  
 espoused their Cause as even to draw that Court to proceed against them, and  
 whereas it is Obvious to this Generall Assembly that the said Macnemara is  
 Insolence how much Increased since he has had the Honours be-  
 Employed to prosecute the Sails of the Cross by the means of the  
 Maurice Birchfield Esq: inasmuch that he has affronted the
