

Governour and Chancellor of this Province Publicly in the Execution of his Office and altho' required by the right Hon^{ble} the Lords Baltimore and Guilford to make a reasonable Submission for such his Offence, has wilfully Declined it, altho' his Excellency was Pleas'd to give him wth Great Tenderneſſ a handsome Opportunity of doing it which gives sufficient Testimony of the Said Maenemars Continued Resolution to Persist in the Justification of his Ill Conduct, which Sundry Magistrates of the best Estate have Declared themselves by their Representations in Writing to this present

Generall Assembly so uneasy under that they will no longer Continue in their Sessions if so Turbulent and Insolent a Person be allowed to Practice before them, all which Accions and Many more Some whereof, has been Committed of and others been Acquitted from by his Management of Jurys and Subtilty in the Law, too tedious & numerous, are of so highly and Scaring a Nature that the Honour of the Governm^t cannot be Supported nor the Magistrates be Safe and Easy in the Execution of Justice, nor the peace of this Province preserved unless some Remedy be provided not only for the Discouragem^t of him the Said Thomas Maenemara but all others of like Demeanor, It is therefore humbly

Prayed that it may be Enacted AND be it Enacted by the right Honourable the Lord Proprietarie by and with the Advice and Consent of his Lordships Governour and the upper and Lower Houses of a Assembly and the Authority of the same That the Severall Magistrates in this Province be and are hereby required to Observe with Strictness the Demeanor of all Practitioners before them as well as others who shall use any undecent Liberties to the Lessning the Grandour of the respective Courts, and be and are hereby required and Impowred to Discourtenance and Punish the same by Suspension or fine, at their Discretion, not Exceeding One thousand pounds of Tobacco, for any one Offence on pain of being Condemned by the Legislature of this Province for Neglect of their Duties in suffering his Lordships the right Hon^{ble} the Lord Proprietaries Authority to be Trampled on and Giving up the Dignity thereof. All be it Likewise Enacted that the Said Thomas Maenemara for his Continued ill practices be and is hereby from henceforth Disabled from practicing the Law as Council Attorney Solicitor or otherwise in any Court of Judicature within this Province any Law Statute or usage to the contrary Notwithstanding and is hereby granted to the Said Maenemara a Liberty to finish all such Accions now depending wherein it appears by record that he is actually concerned for any person or persons, or behaving himself directly or indirectly in the Chancery Court wherein he has been already suspended and is hereby granted that all Accions that relate to the Crown and are now depending therein be and are hereby referred to the Lower House of a Assembly May 4 1712 Read and Reported to by the Lower House of a Assembly
