Possession of the said tract of Land with its Appurtenances, And whereas  
the said John Beale has been at an Insupportable Expence in the vindication  
of his right to the premises to the damage of his family  
notwithstanding the Justice of his cause and that it may be justly  
whether he be not Barred of recovering his damages by the said several Decrees  
wherefore it is thought reasonable to provide all due Pains and Distractions  
of that Port Fowle End It is further Enacted by the Authority  
Advice and Consent aforesaid that the said John Beale Shall be enabled  
to prosecute any Suit or suits at Law or Equity for the Recovery  
of his Damages and Costs as fully and Amply as he might have done  
had he had rule or Bearer back passed in the Commission any Thing issued  
thereunder or Bearer or any Allusion to the Contrary notwithstanding  
in the said Case
