An Act for disabling Thomas Maenemara Esquire to Practice the Law within this Province

Whereas Thomas Maenemara Esq. late Practitioner of the Law and Attorney in Several of the Courts within this Province has been sundry times Suspended here and in the Province of Pennsylvania for his Misdeeds and readmitted to his practice on his faire promises of Amendment And whereas by an Act of Assembly of this Province Entituled An Act for the regulating the Practice of Attorneys of this Province and Ascertaining Fees to the Attorney General Clerk of Judgments Attorney and Practitioners of the Law in the Courts of this Province and for Securing the same by way of Execution the Several Courts have power Given them to Admitt and suspend such Practitioner as Also the Crown and whereas the said Tho. Maenemara on late suspension from his Practice obtained his late Majesties order to be readmitted againe which the said Maenemara has often suggested to be an Exemption of him from the power Given the severall Courts by that Law, where by the Authority of those Courts are not onely become Dubious in that part, but the said Maenemara has wrongfully depended on the said Order as his Justification to treat them in an Indecent Manner when he pleads before them, and even to despise their Authority and affront their Officers which they have been cautious of Punishing him for being partly Deterred by the Great Interest in England where on he has frequently Valued himself as being far Superior to theirs and partly by the threatening Seditious and revengefull temper as well as his method of practising upon many unthinking people
