

The Humble Representation of Some of the Justices of the said  
Court Humbly Sheweth That: Maunemara  
a practitioner of the Law in the Provincial and Other Courts in this province  
is a person of such a turbulent Refactory Haughty and Abusive Temper that  
it hath been his common Practice (when his Circumstances would by any  
means Support him) to Dispute & affront and Contemn the Authority of  
the Justices of such Courts Especially that of the Provincials, for which  
he hath been heretofore Suspended, and upon his humble petition setting  
forth his Acknowledgment of the Offence and Solemn promises of  
Regulating his Behaviour for the future he hath been restored to his  
Practice, which the Records of this province do manifestly make appear  
That notwithstanding his former Submission he has repeated his  
Insolent and Contumacious behaviour by upbraiding the Chief Justice  
of the Provincial Court with Partiality and even daring the Court to proceed  
or give Judgment in many Cases contrary to his Sentiments, such  
particularly at a Special Court of Oyer and Terminer & Goal Delivery  
for the tryal of certain Delinquents upon bills of indictment found by them  
for firing the Great Guns at the City of Annapolis on the pretence of the  
Right wherein the said Court in Order to run down and Destroy  
the Jurisdiction thereof and to intimidate the Judges who denyed  
the Warrant of a writ of Habeas Corpus for removing the said Judgments  
into the Provincial Court, he there maliciously and insolently  
said to me see who dare try them by this Commission, In fine the  
whole Course of his life is so Turbulent and Disorderly that he hath  
very rarely been clear of some Criminal prosecution or other in the pro-  
vincial Court for many years, some of which he hath been convicted  
of, altho' his artful and audacious Management of the subtle  
and tricking part of the Law hath acquitted him from many more  
which with as much Justice he deserved punishment for, That  
in many more instances too tedious to insert the S. Maunemara has  
behaved himself with Insolence and Contempt at all which the  
Several Justices after some resentments have past over in hope  
of his reformation, but such his intolerable pride and insolence that  
of late he has not scrupled to insult & affront his Excellency  
both as Governour and Keeper of the Great Seal, as may evidently  
appear by two Judgments now depending in that Court found  
by him by the Grand inquest for this province and the reasons for his  
(Suspension)
