

Micajah Perry and Company their factors agents or assigns that shall require the same without any fee for the same or for the lodging thereof saving the Right of the Lord Proprietarie his heirs and Successors and of all Bodies Politick or Corporate Provided Nevertheless that in case the said Mareschal shall at any time after the Making such his Oath as aforesaid be Convict of Willfull or Corrupt perjury or of a Willfull Breach or Noncompliance with the Tenour of such Oath that then the said Mareschal upon Conviction shall be adjudged to stand two hours in the pillory and have his left ear cut off and shall be wholly Deprived of any the Benefits Designed him by this Law and shall from thenceforth be liable to be prosecuted for any Debt or Demand whatsoever in the same Manner as if this Act had never been made - anything hereing contained to the contrary notwithstanding - Provided Nevertheless that nothing in this Act contained shall extend to or be construed to extend to Deprive the Reverend Jacob Henderson from enjoying the Benefits and Advantages to him of his all belonging on account of a bond passed from the said Mareschal to the said Henderson for the making Over and Conveying of the Majesty of a certain Tract of Land called Howartons Range in the simple for the Considerations therein mentioned but that the said Mareschal shall be empowered by this Act and he is hereby empowered to Convey the said Land in fee simple to the said Henderson in as full and ample manner as he could or Ought to have done had this Act never been made or had the said Mareschal been at Large at the Time of executing the said bond and the purchase money to be applied to the use of Micajah Perry and Company Merchants in London to be vested as aforesaid -
