

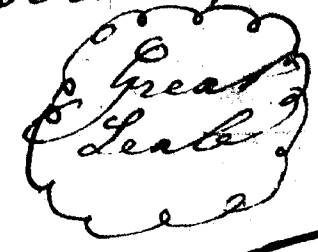

Exam. An Act for the Naturalization of Joseph Lazear and Gustavus Heselius  
of Prince George's County and their Children, and Also Christian Geist  
of the City of Annapolis Gent -

Be it Enacted by the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary  
by and with the Advice and consent of his Lordships Govern-  
ment and the upper and lower Houses of Assembly and the Authority  
of the Same, that Joseph Lazear of Prince George's County planter  
born under the Dominions of the Emperor of Germany and had  
Children Joseph, Thomas, John, Elizabeth, Mary and Deborah  
Lazear born in this Province, Gustavus Heselius of Prince  
George's County aforesaid Linner, born under the Dominions  
of the King of Sweden and his Daughter Mary Heselius born  
in this Province, and all and Every of them, and the said  
Children born within this Province, and also Christian  
Geist of the City of Annapolis in Annapurcell County Gen-  
tleman, born under the Dominions of the said King of Swe-  
den be and in all things adjudged taken reputed had held and  
Governed as his Majesty's Naturall born Subjects of this  
Province and that they and every of them by the Authority  
aforesaid be Enabled and adjudged to all intents and purposes  
to demand and Challenge, have hold and enjoy any Lands Ten-  
ements rents and hereditaments to which they or any of them  
might in any wise be intituled to within this Province as if  
they and every of them had been his Majesty's free and Naturall  
born Subjects and like People thereof they the said Joseph  
Lazear, Gustavus Heselius, and Christian Geist, having taken
