

Whereas Rob: Tivis Andrew Castle and Gilbert Powlson of Ann-  
rundell County, George Sexton of Queen Anns County John Robinson  
of Talbot County planters have by their Humble Petitions to this pre-  
sent Generall Assembly severally set forth that they have conti-  
nued Prisoners for Debt in the Custody of the Sheriffs of the several  
Countys aforesaid viz: Robert Tivis, Andrew Castle and Gilbert  
Powlson, in the Custody of the Sheriff of Annrundell County,  
George Sexton in the Custody of the Sheriff of Queen Anns County  
and John Robinson in the Custody of the Sheriff of Talbot County  
for some considerable time past and still continue in the like  
deplorable Circumstances not being able to redeem their Bodies  
with all the Estate or Interest they have in the World, which they  
would readily Surrender up and part with to their severall and  
respective Creditors if they would accept of the same and grant
