

362 I shall or may by Vertue of this Act make and Duly Execute any Bond or Deeds for the Conveyance of the said Several Tracts of Land & Mills with the Appurtenances to the said Several purchasers and their heirs forever in as full and ample and Effectual a manner as the J. Robt. Grundy might have Done or could do if Living, and that such Bonds or Conveyances shall be as valid and Effectual to all intents and purposes to bar and Charge the heirs of the said Robert and to Invest the purchasers with good and firm Estates in the premises as if Legally Executed by him the said Robert any Law usage or Custom to the contrary notwithstanding Provided always that what remain'd unpaid of the Consideration Money to the said Robt. in his life time shall be Accounted as debts in the hands of ~~the~~ his Exors and Deors as part of his Personal Estate and Lyable to the same Distribution and Application, & Provided that the Exors shall save harmless and indemnified the Estate of the said Robert Grundy from all Penalties and forfeitures for not Conveying the said Lands and Mills according to the Tenor of any Bond or other Writing by him Executed for that purpose saving always to our soon Lord the King the said Lord Proprietary their heirs and Successors and all their Heirs and Exors and all others not mentioned in this Act their Several and Respective Rights
