

that on Representation made by the Land Officer that shall appear in the first  
 at any time appointed forasmuch that any person not exempt by Law shall not have  
 made their appearance according to his Warrant or Summons provided as the Law  
 of this Province Direct. It shall and may be Lawfull for any two Justices  
 of the County to Summon the Delinquent or Others concerned and on hearing &  
 fully Examining into his Offence and Expence to Cause him to be executed or licensed  
 as shall be most just and most agreeable to the Intent of the Law now in force  
 for the better Regulating the Militia Provided that in Case any person  
 Summons to appear before such Justices shall not appear or otherwise  
 Expence themselves it shall be Lawfull for such Justices to Judge their Case as  
 on Default. And be it further Enacted that an Act Entituled an Act  
 for Ordering and Regulating the Militia of this Province for the better Defence  
 and Security thereof made at a Session of a Assembly begun and hold at the City  
 of Annapolis the twenty sixth day of April Anno Domini 1722 hundred  
 and fifteen be and is hereby approved and continued in full force

An Act to prohibit the clandestine Running of Tobacco into any

Whereas severall persons Residing and Trading within this Province  
 regardles of the Common Interest thereof for the sake of their own private Advantage  
 carry large Quantities of Tobacco into severall of the Neighbouring Colonies w<sup>ch</sup>  
 without any Entry thereof paying the Lawfull Duty or giving any Security  
 to prevent its being Carried into places prohibited by Law contrary to the Manifest  
 Intent of severall Acts of Parliament to the prejudice of the Crown & Lord  
 Proprietor as well as the Discouragement of the trader of the Province to whom it  
 which doth Be it Enacted by the Rt Honble the Lord Proprietor by &c
