Whereas by a Bill of Assembly intituled an Act Declaring the Rights of these lots Begun
to be built in Philadelphia for the Towns Mentioned It is intituled the Three Golden Lots that is to say
the Lot for the Rector or Vicar or Incumbent of the Coll of Lancaster One other for the
End of the said Coll for the time being And the third for the Coll of the Rectory And the
Expenses for the same to be paid and remain to the several lots as originally Design'd in laying
out the said lots And according to an Ordinance of Assembly made April the ninth instant hundred
and six thousand two hundred and six by the said Bill of Assembly Whereas being that the said may more easily appear and
therefore for want of proper encouragement to improve the said lots they become useless to the Rector
of the said Coll by the Intituted of the Coll aforesaid It is Prayed that it may be enacted —

And be it enacted by the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietor and with the Advice and
Consent of his Lordships Governor and the Upper and Lower houses of Assembly and the Authority of
the said Lord for the better to Encourage such as will build upon or otherwise Improve between the
said lots a place and may be lawfull for the Doctor or Incumbent for the time being And he is by this
act permitted to let a part of the said lots or any part of the said lots for a term of years not exceeding
the sum of twenty two years to such Person or Persons as shall be willing to build upon & Improve
the same During which Term of years the Doctor or Person and their Drawing under their seal
and sign an Indenture and Deedable Propriet. of such Lots or Part of lots without any
set Licens or Mortgagation whatsoever — Provided nevertheless that if any person or number
of the said persons shall be Desirous to settle on or Improve the said lots or any part of them —

Upon the same or before base built or made any other Improvement it shall be lawfull for him so to do
to let the said number first Remunerating the said Doctor or Person all the Charges and Expenses they
are bound to in the Building upon or Otherwise Improving the same And the said Doctor shall then
have full liberty in this Act to the contrary notwithstanding —



Act to Prevent the Summitious Meetings and Other Irregularities of
Examined & C. & P. a. a. by his Dut in Philadelphia for the Towns Mentioned

Whereas the Great Session of Assembly have had under their Consideration the late Conquest made
so May afford the suffering of Negro and other slaves to meet in great Numbers on Sabbath and other
Weekdays and keeping of horses cattle or dogs of their own Rec'd intituled by the Right Honourable
the Lord Proprietor by and with the Advice and Consent of his Lordships Governor And the Upper and Lower
houses of Assembly and the Authority of the same That the Justice of the several and respective County
Courts within the Province be had that the newly improved and revised Journals of the Publication
of this Act shall be yearly in November sent to the Constables of every hundred where the said
parties at their discretion shall think proper and expedient to suppress the assembling and summitious meeting
of Negro and other slaves for that very Constable so to be appointed shall be obliged to repair the
