

First day of November and the last Day of May Yearly shall have the same
 benefits privileges and advantages as they might have had by virtue of the said
 recited Act in case of Endors between the first day of November and the last of March
 yearly any limitation therein contained to the contrary notwithstanding provided
 always that the Creditor shall not be obliged to receive Tobacco of less weight or
 worse quality than the Debtor hath contracted to pay any thing in this or the said
 recited Act to the contrary notwithstanding and be it enacted that Tobacco to be paid
 to the Sheriff in Discharge of Publick and other Dues and Fees shall and may be viewed
 examined as the said recited Act directs Tobacco to Discharge other Debts to be viewed and
 examined and that where any person hath good Merchable Tobacco in Kegs Leads or
 in parcels of the Debt be but a parcel ready to pay the Sheriff and Endors the same
 and that notwithstanding such Endor the Sheriff shall take the party Endorsing such
 Tobacco or his or her Goods in Execution without suffering such Tobacco to be viewed
 allowing a reasonable time for such view not to exceed ten Days that in all such
 Cases the Sheriff shall not only have no Fees but also be liable to an Action of false
 Imprisonment or Trespass and to pay Double Damages and Cost of Suit to the party
 provided any Law Usage or Custom to the contrary notwithstanding
