An ACT for Limitation of Officers Fees.

BE IT ENACTED, by the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietor, by and with the Advice and Consent of His Lordship's Governour, and the Upper and Lower Houses of Assembly, and the Authority of the same, That from and after the End of this present Session of Assembly, no Officer or Officers hereafter mentioned in this present Act, their Ministers, Servants, or Deputies, by reason or Colour of his or their Office or Offices, shall have, receive, or take of any Person or Persons, directly or indirectly, any other Fees than by this Act is hereafter limited and allowed to the several Officers hereafter mentioned :

To the Chancellor, or Keeper of the Great Seal,

- For The Seal of an Original Writ, Six Pounds of Tobacco.
- The Seal of a *Recordari*, Twelve Pounds of Tobacco.
- The Seal of a *Subpna ad Respondendum*, with three Names, or under, Fifteen Pounds of Tobacco.
- The Seal to a Proclamation of Rebellion, Three Hundred and Sixty Pounds of Tobacco.
- The Seal of a Commission of Rebellion, Three Hundred and Sixty Pounds of Tobacco.
- The Seal of a Grant of Land, for One Hundred Acres, or under, One Hundred and Twenty Pounds of Tobacco.
- Every Hundred Acres above One Hundred Acres, Twelve Pounds of Tobacco.
- Seal of a Decree in Chancery, Four Hundred and Thirty Pounds of Tobacco.
- Seal of an Injunction in Chancery, Two Hundred and Forty Pounds of Tobacco.
- Seal of an *Audita Querela*, One Hundred and Twenty Pounds of Tobacco.
- Seal to Execution of a Decree in Chancery, One Hundred Sixty Two Pounds of Tobacco.
