At a General Session of ASSEMBLY, begun and held at the City of Annapolis, on Tuesday the Tenth Day of October, 1727, the following Laws were Enacted.

## An ACT for ascertaining the Form of the Oath of Judge or Justice.

HEREAS the Oath of Judge or Justice, (appointed to be taken by the Statute of the Eighteenth of Edward Laws not hathe Third,) does not in many Particulars provide for the vingprovided Constitution of this Province, nor suit the Circumstances an Oath of Judge, &c. of any other Proprietary Government; and for that the Oath of su table to the Judge or Justice, proper to be taken in this Province, is not ascer-Constitution tain'd by any ACT of our own:

Be it therefore Enacted, by the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary, by and with the Advice and Consent of His Lordship's Governour, and the Upper and Lower Houses of Assembly, and the Authority of the same, That at some convenient Time, after the End It is now of this present Session of Assembly, and before the last Day of March the following next, the following Oath shall be taken, as the proper Oath of Of- Out shall be fice, by the Members of the Court of Appeals, as Judges to correct tiken by all Errors in Judgments and other Proceedings at Law, the Justices of tices, by the the Provincial and County-courts, and the Mayor, Recorder, and Time here lie Aldermen of the City of Annapolis, for the Time being, changing only what is to be changed, according to the different Stations of fuch Magistrates, viz.

"YOU shall swear, That as a Justice of the Provincial Court of
"Maryland in all Articles of his Tordhing Court of Maryland, in all Articles of his Lordship's Commission to of Judge or "You directed, You shall do equal Law and Right to all the King's "Subjects, rich and poor, according to the Directions of the Acts of "Assembly of this Province, so far forth as they provide: And, " where they are filent, according to the Laws, Statutes, and rea-" sonable Customs of England, agreeable to the Usage and Constitu-"tion of this Province; and not delay any Person of Common Right, for the Letters of the King, the Lord Proprietary, or of any other " whatsoever, nor for any other Cause: And in case any Letters " shall come to You, contrary to Law, that You do nothing by them, but cause them to be entered on Record, and certify the "King, the Lord Proprietor, or the Governour (for the Time be-" ing) of them, and proceed to execute the Law notwithstanding " the same Letters: That You shall hold your Courts according to
