that all Perlons thipping their own Tobacco, shall be obliged to roll rolltheir own the same within one Mile of some convenient Landing; under the Tobacco. like Penalties with thole that fell or pay away their Tobacco; to be recovered by any Person that will prosecute for the same, before a Penalties to fingle Magistrare, where the Penalty shall not exceed Four Hundred be recovered, Pounds of Tobacco; and where it shall exceed that Quantity, to be and applied. recovered in the County-court, by Action of Debt, Bill, Plaint, or Information, wherein no Essoyn, Protection, or Wager of Law to be allowed. The one Half thereof to the use of publick Schools in the several Counties where such Forseiture shall arise, the other Half to the Informer, or him or them that shall inform and prosecute for. the same. Any Law, Usage, or Custom to the contrary, notwith-

standing.
