

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the said Town, when laid out as before directed, shall thence-forward be called and distinguished by the Name of *Cecil Town*, and not by any other Name or Distinction whatsoever.

SAVING to His Most Sacred Majesty, his Heirs and Successors; the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary, his Heirs and Successors; and to all Bodies Politick and Corporate; and all Persons not mentioned in this Act, their several and respective Rights; any Thing in this Act to the contrary, notwithstanding.

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, by the Authority, Advice, and Consent aforesaid, That every Person taking up, or being in Possession of any the Lots to be taken up in the aforesaid Town, shall pay yearly unto the Agent of the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary, for the Time being; for the Use of the said Lord Proprietary, One Penny Current Money of *Maryland* per Annum: And that the Clerk of the said Commissioners do transmit to his Lordship's Agent, an Account of all Lots taken up, pursuant to the Directions of this Act.

An ACT for the building a Church in Baltimore County, and in a Town called Baltimore Town, in St. Paul's Parish.

WHEREAS, by an Act of Assembly, Intituled, *An Act, empowering the Vestrymen and Churchwardens of St. Paul's Parish, in Baltimore County, to purchase one or more Acres of Land in the said Parish, and to build a Parish Church thereon; as also for raising a Fund to compleat and finish the same,* amongst other Things, it was Enacted, That the Vestrymen and Churchwardens should be authorized and impowered to agree for, and purchase one or more Acres of Land, in the most convenient Part of the said Parish:

AND WHEREAS, it is made appear to this General Assembly, That the said Vestrymen and Churchwardens did purchase some Land, in order to build a Church thereon; but that the same is not begun; which being very inconvenient, and the Inhabitants of *Baltimore County*, upon Application to the General Assembly, having had a Town laid out in the same Parish, called *Baltimore Town*, which is only Two Miles Distance from the Land purchased as aforesaid, they the Parishioners of the same Parish, now praying the Liberty of building their Church in the same Town; as also that the Tobacco to have been raised, by Virtue of the former Act, may be only applied to the building of a Church in *Baltimore Town*:

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED, by the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietor, by and with the Advice and Consent of his Lordship's Governour, and the Upper and Lower Houses of Assembly, and the Authority of the same, That the Vestrymen and Churchwardens of the same Parish, or the major Part of them, be, and are hereby authorized
